

GLOBAL CORRUPTION BAROMETER SURVEY 2013

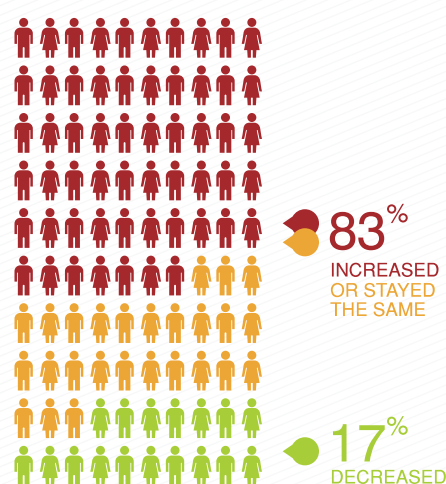
TI is a global movement sharing one vision: a world in which government, business, civil society and the daily lives of people are free of corruption.

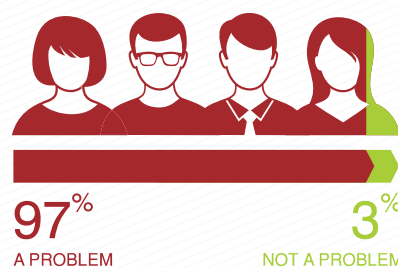

69% PAY BRIBE TO SPEED THINGS

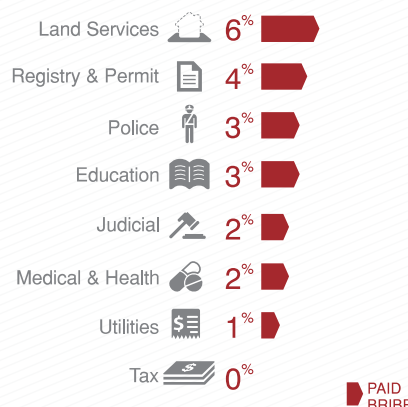
0% TO GET A CHEAPER SERVICE

6% PAID BRIBES FOR LAND SERVICES

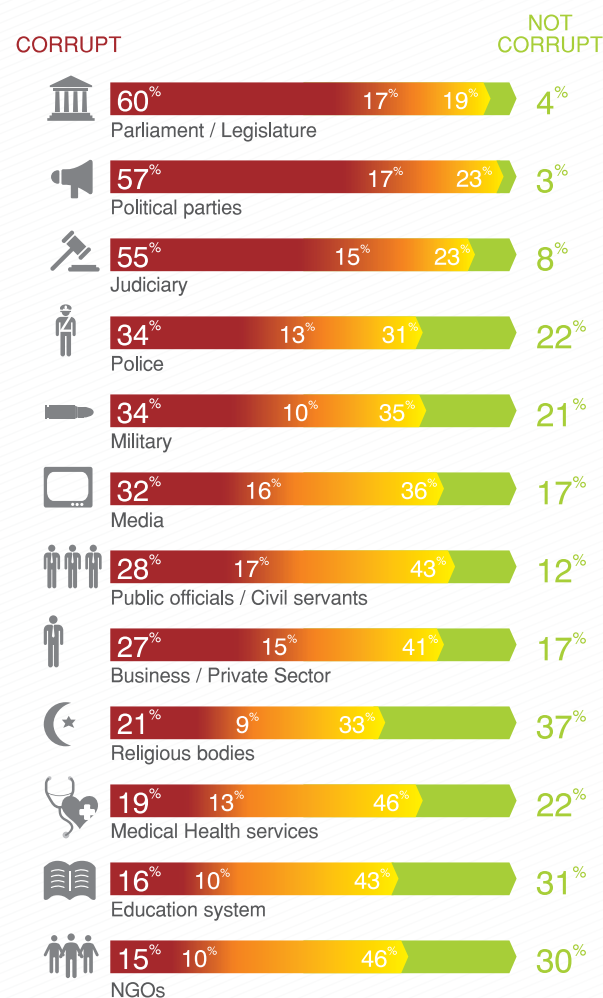

65% BELIEVE THAT PERSONAL CONTACTS ARE IMPORTANT TO GET THINGS DONE



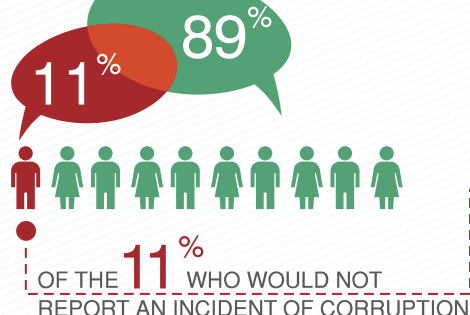

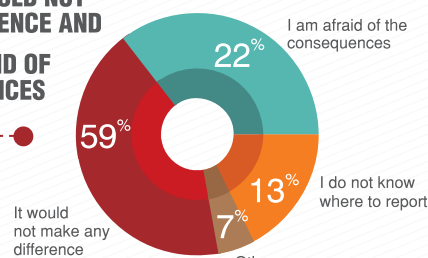
