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# TRANSPARENCY MALDIVES NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE PERIOD FROM 01 JANUARY TO 31 DECEMBER 2014

#### 1 Background

Transparency Maldives (TM) was established in 2007 to address persistent concerns over corruption and catalyze greater transparency and accountability in Maldives. It has a Board of Directors. Transparency Maldives envisions a Maldives in which government, politics, business, civil society, and the daily lives of all people shall be free from corruption.

#### 2 Affiliation and Registration

Transparency Maldives is a non-partisan organization that endeavors to be a constructive force by promoting collaboration and discussion on corruption, transparency, and accountability. TM seeks to engage with stakeholders from all sectors (government, business, politics and civil society, among others) to stimulate discussion and raise awareness of corruption's detrimental effects on development and society. Although based in Male' Maldives, the organization views corruption as a national issue and its planned activities extend to the country's outer islands.

Transparency Maldives is currently the contact point of Transparency International (TI) and is in the process of accreditation as a Chapter in Formation of TI.

TM received formal registration (Registration No. T/2007/83/34) from the Ministry of Home Affairs on 19<sup>th</sup> July 2007.

#### 3 Significant Accounting Policies

- a) In view of non-profit nature of the organization, Receipts and Disbursements Statement representing Grants for the stated objective of TM is shown as receipt and all expenditure including capital expenditure is shown as expense.
- **b)** The Financial Statements have been prepared on cash basis. Receipts are accounted in the period in which such receipts are received and disbursements are accounted in the period in which such disbursements are made.
- c) Fixed assets are treated as expenditure and accordingly no depreciation charged on projects' assets.
- d) Items included in the financial statements are measured using the currency of the primary economic environment in which the entity operates ("the functional currency"). The financial statements are presented in United States Dollars (USD), which is the entity's functional and presentation currency. Figures have been rounded off to the nearest USD.
- e) Where necessary, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation in the current year.
